# LANGUAGE, LITERACY & NUMERACY COURSES



These courses are for learners who are not looking for a qualification, but still want to learn some basic skills. They may assist as a pathway to further education, training and employment. You can enrol at any time. These courses are subject to sufficient enrolments.

The course costs are either on a term, semester or full year basis depending on the course. To be eligible for pre-accredited program Government funding, prospective learners must be:

- an Australian or New Zealand Citizen or holder of an Australian Permanent Visa. (Some Temporary Visas are also eligible).
- 17 years of age and over and not enrolled at school, or under 17 and not enrolled at school with an exemption from school.

Government subsidised students with a valid current concession card from Centrelink, are eligible for concession fees.



# LANGUAGE, LITERACY & NUMERACY COURSES

## Writers Workshop

Adult literacy students will learn research and interview skills and extend their literacy skills by writing and publishing their work in a newsletter for the community. Students will have the thrill of seeing their writing in print!

- an Australian or New Zealand Citizen or holder of an Australian Permanent Visa. (Some Temporary Visas are also eligible).
- 17 years of age and over and not enrolled at school, or under 17 and not enrolled at school with an exemption from school.

Government subsidised students with a valid current concession card from Centrelink, are eligible for concession fees.
